## KEY CHALLENGES AND RECOMMENDATION

# **Challenges**

High level of dependency on other agencies for execution of the committees' deliverables Delay in approval of standards across the commodities ecosystem – Agriculture and Mining

Low and infrequent convergence of committee members

## Recommendations

Inter-agency engagements to be spearheaded by the Commission. This would drive more buy-ins and give credibility to the Committee's mandate

Engagement with the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, the Ministry of Solid Minerals and the Ministry of Blue Economy to align the Committee's goals with the respective ministries

Reconstitution of the Committee to include senior subject matter experts in relevant agencies critical in driving the execution of the Committee's mandate
